FAQ – Frequently asked questions

Dear Student,

Before writing an email, please read the questions and answers below carefully to see if you can find the answer to your question.

When will my email be answered?

Please note that usually I have 500+ students in more than 20 different courses, and it takes a huge amount of time for me to respond to every student's emails. Although there is currently no university regulation on the deadline for this, I try to respond to these emails within three business days. (Please note, that Saturdays and Sundays are not business days in Hungary. For instance, if you send your email on Saturday, on Sunday, or Friday evening, it means it is received on the next business day (on Monday), so I'll try to respond it by Thursday.) Therefore, please be patient and do not resend your email during this time interval. If you resend your email within this time interval, your first email will be ignored, and you can expect a response time calculated from your last email. Response time may be longer in exceptional cases (summer/winter holidays, conference absences, etc.). I do not respond to students' spam emails.

What qualifies as a students' spam email?

Students' spam emails are emails in which questions or requests are discussed in the **Study and Examination Regulations, Governing Board circulars, Schedule for the academic year, course program, Moodle page of the course** or **instructor's website, and the FAQ section** available on it.
